Year 1

Science & D&T

This term, we have been learning about how to grow plants. We have learnt what plants need to grow strong and healthy and we have also learnt about the parts of a plant. We had a special visitor come in and teach us about how to identify different types of trees based on their leaves. We enjoyed completing this challenge and then did some leaf rubbings!

Once we finished our science LE, we started our Design and Technology LE. For this, we designed and made our own plant based pop up cards. This involved learning how to do different types of folds in order to make the card work. We then made these cards and evaluated our finished designs.

Geography

For our final Year 1 learning experience, we are answering this enquiry question "What would a pilot see if they flew over Torbay?" We have been looking on Google Earth at where we live and have learnt all the key features in Paignton, Torquay and Brixham. We have also completed map work and used compass directions to help us! We also have a real pilot coming in to talk to us about what it's like to fly planes.

In Year Two, the children have been very busy completing a design technology learning experience. They had to make something that they could use in their gardens. After carrying out some market research and evaluating different products we decided to make wind chimes. The children had to learn how to saw, thread, tie knots and drill before they were able to use these skills to create their own wind chimes




For our D&T Learning Experience, we have been designing plant pots. We did some market research and created our designs. We then created our designs out of air-drying and then decorated them.
























Year 4

Year 4 have been very busy this half term. We started by investigating electricity, how does it work? What materials can it pass through? We then used this knowledge to design and create our own functional circuits. We then put our cooking skills into practise by making our own fruit jam, pairing a variety of flavours with apple such as blackberry, raspberry, pear, cinnamon and blueberry.

During our recent DT learning experience, the children had the opportunity to adapt a simple bread recipe so that they could make some bread for a family member. They began the journey by doing some market research, including taste testing! We were lucky enough to have the help of a baking expert, Maxine (who used to run her own bakery) and Chef Daisy. The class really enjoyed the whole process and as you can see, the final outcomes were incredible. They also designed and made packaging for their bread and carefully considered the customer, aesthetics, materials and the environment. Year 5 children followed the Plan, Do, Review cycle and created their own success criteria to ensure their products were high quality.























Thirteen of our Year 6 students were successfully awarded the Torbay and Devon Civic Award 2022/2023. Well done!




ACE PERFORMANCE
